You may need to raid your piggy bank or find some other loose change to help you answer this one!











I have a whole load of coins in my pocket, but I do not have exact change for one pound.


What is the maximum possible amount of change I could have in my pocket if I do not have any £2 coins?

Change for a pound - answer.


I have a whole load of coins in my pocket, but I do not have exact change for one pound.
